

Primary Update

Children in Saplings, Elm and Ash classes have had a very productive February! Saplings enjoyed a Stay & Play session at the beginning of the month with parents coming into the classroom to see their children and their work. Ash and Elm class have been learning about the weather and the world around us. They also enjoyed a visit from a librarian from Wokingham Library.

Saplings Class: Saplings class have been reading "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" in class and have been tasting different foods from the story. They have also been learning about crossing the road safely in order to prepare for trips in the future.

Elm Class: The students in Elm class have been able to settle really well back into their school day routines. As a class, we have been exploring the topic of the term which is 'Weather of the World.' All the children have shown great engagement in their sensory exploration of different weathers that can be experienced around the world and how what we wear changes depending on the weather.

Ash Class: We have started our new topic of Weather around the World! We have already looked at pictures and vocabulary of different weathers and how the world around us changes for each season. In our lessons in PSHE, we have been focusing on how our bodies grow and change as we get older so we have been comparing our heights on a height chart!

Secondary Update

Our secondary classes have had an incredibly busy February! They have been learning the importance of the environment and how to take care of our planet as well as developing their skills to navigate the outside world. On the 21st and 22nd February, we invited parents to an exhibition to come and see their child's work which was very successful!

Beech Class: In Beech class, students are currently engrossed in Anthony McGowan's novel "Brock," with a particular focus on the author's techniques for generating empathy towards the characters. Students have shown a good understanding when constructing and measuring angles in Maths and now we will be moving over to understanding and problem solving with Fractions and Percentages. In History, we have been focusing on World War 2 and students have actively been participating in class discussions. This half term, Beech class will be taking the lead on planning trips out in the community and learning to navigate Google Maps appropriately and developing their social skills.

Chestnut Class: Chestnut class have had a busy February. We have finished our book from last term and wrote a book review about 'The Great Foodbank Heist' to encourage others to read. We started our new book 'The Stinking story of rubbish'. We identified what rubbish is and where it all goes. In World About Me, we have been looking at types of recycling and learnt about landfill sites. We learnt about litter picking, the benefits for our environment and then went litter picking around the school for our life skills lessons. In cooking, we made a delicious paella, some fish parcels and cheese and herb pasties.

Maple Class: Maple class had an excellent visit to Kimel Café prior to half term, when the owner gave the students a talk on future opportunities which the students engaged well in whilst enjoying their tasty treat. As well as a visit to Wokingham library where students engaged really well and took out a book to reading within our independent reading session. Within maths we have been continuing to develop our understanding of angles within triangles and developing our ability to use different resources to draw polygons. We are continuing to develop our analytical and predicative writing within English and the story of Brock, students engage well and contribute within lessons. Within Science we have been looking at periodic table, atoms, diatomic molecules and displacement reactions. We have been exploring WWI with history and have introduce students to Boccia within PE and are going to add this as a lunchtime club as students have enjoyed it so much.

Willow Class: Recently, Willow Class have been learning about all things recycling. The children have been out on a very successful litter pick in the local community collecting a whopping 4 bags of rubbish in a short space of time. In Maths, the children have begun learning about time and have started telling the time 'to' and 'past' the hour on an analogue clock. Our work with Saplings has continued and prior to half term we joined them for a visit to the park - the Willow Class children were great at supporting the little ones and set a great example as role models. Finally, we had a really successful exhibition which showcased the amazing work our pupils have produced across the course of the year so far!


