Personal Development

Can understand a question or instruction that has 2 parts, such as: 'Get your coat and wait at the door'. To use a wider range of vocabulary

Can sing a large repertoire of songs

Can enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens.

Can understand 'why' questions, like: 'Why do you think the caterpillar got so fat?'

Can sing a large repertoire of songs.

Can use talk to organise themselves and their play: 'Let's go on a bus... you sit there... I'll be the driver'.

Key vocabulary : See, Hear, Smell, Feel, Taste, In, Out, Again, More

Can show 'effortful control', for example, waiting for a turn and resisting the strong impulse to grab what they want or push their way to the front.

Can remember rules without needing an adult to remind them.

Has developed their sense of responsibility and membership of a community.

Can use the toilet with help, and then independently.

Is increasingly able to talk about and manage their emotions.

Can collaborate with others to manage large items, such as moving a long plank safely, carrying large hollow blocks.

Can start eating independently and learning how to use a knife and fork.

Can choose the right resources to carry out their own plan, for example, choosing a spade to enlarge a small hole they dug with a trowel.

Can skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues.

Can use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils

Can start eating independently and learning how to use a knife and fork.

Can make marks on their picture to stand for their name.

Can add some marks to their drawings, which they give meaning to, for example: 'That says mummy.'

Can notice some print, such as the first letter of their name, a bus or door number, or a familiar logo.

Can ask questions about the book, make comments and share their own ideas.

Can sing songs and say rhymes independently, for example, singing whilst playing.

PSHE

Can show 'effortful control', for example, waiting for a turn and resisting the strong impulse to grab what they want or push their way to the front.

Can express preferences and decisions, they also try new things and start establishing their autonomy.

Has developed friendships with other children.

Life skills

Progress to walking to and crossing a minor road with support and stopping at the edge of a kerb when an adult says stop until it is a safe time to cross and the adult says go (holding an adults hand, safe use of wrist straps etc...)

Community visits

Sharing a playground with others in class and the public.

Being safe in playing alongside other children in more unfamiliar areas.

Mathematics

Number

Can solve real-world mathematical problems with numbers up to 5.

Can experiment with their own symbols and marks as well as numerals.

Can react to changes of the amount in a group of up to 3 items.

Can count in everyday contexts, sometimes skipping numbers - '1-2-3-5'.

Shape, space and measure

Can compare sizes, weights etc. using gesture and language - 'bigger, little, smaller', 'high or low', 'tall', 'heavy'.

Can compare amounts, saying 'lots', 'more' or 'same'.

Patterns:

Can notice patterns and arrange things in a pattern.

Key vocabulary Circle, square, star, triangle, rectangle, fill, empty, pour, on, in, now, soon, gone, time
