

Speech and Language Therapist Update



Dear Families.

As the 2nd half of Autumn term reaches us, I am really excited to begin delivering enhanced Speech and Language Therapy groups and lessons to the classes.

All classes have weekly 'Word of the Week' sessions to develop their understanding of maths vocabulary - be sure to ask them what their word is!

Sapling and Elm class have been focusing on developing their use of symbols and signing to communicate. Sensory stories are a messy but enjoyable way for them to engage and understand stories too!

Next week, Ash class will be starting 'Storytelling', where the children will enjoy acting out stories to develop their understanding of the plot and say what is happening.

Chestnut, Willow, Maple and Beech are developing their understanding and management of their emotions in weekly Emotional Literacy lessons. We are also rolling out 'Points of View' lessons, where the students can discuss, share their opinions and engage in debate about current affairs.

Primary Update

Children in Saplings, Elm and Ash have had a very busy couple of weeks. The children are continuing to come into school happily and ready and eager to learn. They loved celebrating Halloween!

Saplings Class: Saplings class have started a new topic all around 'people who help us'. They have created their own lollipop sticks to use outside in the primary playground to help support our community visit to learn how to cross a zebra crossing safely. Sapling class have started to look at 'We're going on a bear hunt' in my communication and looked at prepositions such as, over, under and through.

Elm Class: Elm class have really enjoyed exploring are sensory story of 'One winter's day' where the children have explored various sensory inputs. The class have also really enjoyed looking at the different things we can wear to stay warm in cold weather. The class have also really enjoyed completing a sensory circuit in the mornings which has really helped them with engaging with their learning.

Ash Class: In Ash class we have been exploring events that happen in the dark such as camping, bonfires and fireworks. We have learnt about safety at events such as Fireworks Night and have sung a song to remember the rules. We have had some experience days to explore the food eaten at these events, and to experience the world around us in a safe environment. We threw a Bonfire and Firework party and will be indoor camping this week!

Secondary Update

Our secondary classes have enjoyed a variety of activities this week. They are all busy preparing for their Christmas plays for parents to enjoy!

Chestnut Class: Chestnut class started off the half term with a Halloween party. They worked together to wrap their friends and teachers up as mummies. We designed and carved our own pumpkins, which were judged by Cass, who announced our winner! In English, we started reading our new book 'The Firework Maker's Daughter'. We have been writing letters from Lila's point of view to help us think about other people's emotions. In Maths, we have begun adding two 4-digit numbers with exchange using place value charts, column method and applying this to reasoning problems.

Willow Class: This week, Willow class have had a fantastic week. Everybody has been focused and on task. We have been getting to grips with our new English text 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' and have written letters from Lila's perspective, exploring character voice and emotion. On Wednesday, we were treated to a visit from Miriam who brought her tools along. The children were excellently behaved and acted safely and appropriately at all times, whilst productively acquiring new DIY skills.

Beech Class: Beech Class have had a good week! They enjoyed dressing up for Halloween and got involved with the Halloween activities. The boys are excited to play for the Oak Tree School football team. Beech Class have been choosing their characters and writing a script for the Christmas play and they cannot wait for the parents to come and watch it.

Maple Class: Maple class have continued with their positive engagement in learning. We have explored the world around us and the impact of plastic on the environment in Geography which has sparked a class environmental project for the school. We have continued to develop our fundamental skills within English, Maths and Science. Within Dance, PE and yoga students have worked on core strength, basic fitness and core skills which they have embraced. They have continued to enjoy the wider curriculum and Maple are looking forward to their class Christmas performance and have lots of fun ideas for this.
